

Tomáš Kačo — Artist Biography

Tomáš Kačo is a distinguished Czech pianist, composer, and cultural ambassador whose profound artistry has earned him international acclaim across Europe and the United States. Renowned for his masterful fusion of classical piano virtuosity, jazz improvisation, and Romani musical heritage, Kačo creates a compelling and deeply emotive concert experience that resonates with diverse audiences worldwide.

Born and raised in the Czech Republic, Tomáš Kačo completed his rigorous formal education with a Master's degree in Classical Piano from the prestigious Academy of Performing Arts in Prague. Further honing his artistic vision and technical prowess, he pursued advanced studies at the Berklee College of Music in Boston, where he graduated with honors. Following his academic achievements, Kačo established his professional base in Los Angeles, California, where he continues to cultivate his multifaceted career as a soloist, composer, and collaborator.

Tomáš Kačo's recital engagements span some of the world's most esteemed venues, underscoring his stature as an artist of exceptional caliber. Highlights include performances at Carnegie Hall in New York City, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C., and the historic Rudolfinum Concert Hall in Prague, renowned as the home of the Czech Philharmonic Orchestra. His versatility is further demonstrated by soloist appearances with orchestras such as the BOZAR Centre for Fine Arts in Brussels, where he bridges classical tradition with contemporary sensibilities.

In 2021, Tomáš was honored with a prestigious commission from the Czech Philharmonic to compose *Fantasy Open Air*, a set of sophisticated variations on iconic Czech operatic arias. This work premiered as the culminating performance of the orchestra's 125th Open Air concert season, a testament to Kačo's growing influence within the classical music community. Further cementing his role as a cultural figure of national importance, Kačo was commissioned in 2022 by the Office of the Government of the Czech Republic to compose *Stronger than Yesterday*—a large-scale orchestral work premiered by the PKF – Prague Philharmonia at the Rudolfinum and subsequently performed at BOZAR in Brussels. This commission coincided with the Czech Republic's Presidency of the Council of the European Union, reflecting the work's symbolic significance and Kačo's embodiment of Czech cultural diplomacy.

On September 28, 2023, in recognition of his outstanding contributions to Czech culture and music, Tomáš Kačo was awarded the prestigious Silver Medal by the Chairman of the Senate of the Parliament of the Czech Republic on the occasion of the Day of Czech Statehood. In a gesture of gratitude and civic pride, he organized a gala concert titled *Stronger than Yesterday* at the historic Riding Hall of Prague Castle. The event was held under the patronage of the President of the Czech Republic, Petr Pavel, and First Lady Eva Pavlová, further underscoring Kačo's prominent role in the nation's cultural landscape.

Tomáš Kačo's artistic voice is distinguished by its emotional depth, technical mastery, and authentic fusion of tradition and innovation. His ongoing work as a composer and performer reflects a commitment to artistic excellence and cultural dialogue, positioning him as a vital figure in contemporary classical and jazz music. Through international collaborations, recordings, and performances, Kačo continues to expand the boundaries of musical expression, captivating audiences and inspiring new generations of artists.
